27	SECTION 2. DO	NOT CODIFY. Legislative findings.	
28	The General Assembly finds that:		
29	<u>(1) Acco</u>	ording to a 2018 report by the United H	lealth Foundation,

31	<u>(2)</u> Base	ed on the 2017 Centers for Disease Cont	rol and Prevention
32	Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance report, Arkansas ranks highest in the nation		
33	for the percentage of students who:		
34	<u>(A)</u>	Have considered suicide;	
35	<u>(B)</u>	Are considered obese;	
36	(C)	Have been forced to have sex; or	



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1	(D) Use smokeless tobacco;		
2	(3) According to data reported in 2016 by the Centers for		
3	Disease Control and Prevention, Arkansas ranked highest in the nation for		
4	teen birth rates; and		
5	(4) As a result of Arkansas's rankings in these nationwide		
6	findings, it is imperative that the General Assembly ensure that certain		
7	topics are addressed in the student health curriculum in our secondary public		
8	<u>schools.</u>

10	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 16, Subchapter 10, is		
11	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
12	6-16-1005. Health curriculum requirements.		
13	<u>(a) A public school district may offer an age-appropriate health</u>		
14	course with a curriculum that provides instruction to public school students		
15	<u>in grades seven through twelve (7-12) on:</u>		
16	(1)(A) Mental health issues.		
17	(B) Instruction on topics pertaining to mental health		
18	issues under this section shall include the following:		
19	(i) Suicide prevention methods; and		
20	(ii) Information regarding recognition of mental		
21	<u>health crises;</u>		
22	(2)(A) Substance abuse and addiction issues.		
23	(B) Instruction on topics pertaining to substance abuse		
24	and addiction issues under this section shall include information regarding		
25	the following:		
26	(i) Abuse of prescription drugs, illicit drugs,		
27	alcohol, and other substances known to be abused; and		
28	(ii) Substance abuse, consequences of substance		
29	abuse, and prevention methods;		
30	(3)(A) Diet and obesity issues.		
31	(B) Instruction on topics pertaining to diet and obesity		
32	issues under this section shall include information regarding the following:		
33	<u>(i) Obesity;</u>		
34	(ii) Cardiovascular disease; and		
35	(iii) Type 2 diabetes;		
36	(4)(A) Tobacco use prevention and cessation.		

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1	(B) Instruction on topics pertaining to tobacco use
2	prevention and cessation under this section shall include information
3	regarding the following:
4	(i) Adverse health effects of using any form of
5	tobacco or nicotine delivery system;
6	(ii) E-cigarettes and vaping;
7	(iii) Addiction; and
8	(iv) Cessation; and
9	(5)(A) Teenage pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections
10	prevention.
11	(B) Instruction on topics pertaining to teenage pregnancy
12	prevention under this section shall include information regarding the
13	prevention of pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections through age-
14	appropriate and primary prevention-risk avoidance approaches.
15	(C) A parent or legal guardian of a public school student
16	may submit a written request for his or her child to be excused from all or
17	any part of the health curriculum regarding teenage pregnancy and sexually
18	transmitted infections prevention under subdivisions (a)(5)(A) and (B) of
19	this section.
20	(b) The Department of Education shall:
21	(1) Identify, in consultation with the Department of Health,
22	resources required under this section; and
23	(2) Provide professional development support for teachers who
24	are responsible for implementing the health curriculum required under this
25	section.
